The clerk of the senate delivers the engrossed bills from No. 182 to 192, inclusive, endorsed "read and assented to;" which were severally read, assented to, and returned to the senate.

Also the resolution in favour of the public works, and the resolution relative to Strickland's Reports, severally endorsed "assented to."

Also the bill to regulate proceedings upon suits now or hereafter to be brought on the bonds of the clerks of the several county courts, clerks of the court of appeals, and registers of wills in the several counties.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery to raise a sum of money to clear out the creeks leading to and from Upper Marlborough and Queen Anne, in Prince-George's county.

Also the bill to authorise the recovery of certain costs in suits instituted on administration and guardian bonds, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

The bill to regulate the gauging of casks, and the inspection of domestic distilled liquors in the city of Baltimore; the supplement to an act to prevent the unlawful exportation of negroes and mulattoes, and to alter and amend the laws concerning runaways, and to direct their sheriffs respecting the apprehension and commitment; the bill authorising the governor and council of this state to appoint inspectors of salted fish for the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes; the additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough to Hager's Town, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in this state, and for other purposes; and the bill relating to the treasury department, and to regulate the collection and expenditure of the public revenue; severally endorsed "will not pass."

The resolution in favour of the clerks was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The resolution in favour of John Quynn and Andrew Slicer, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The amendment to the bill to regulate lotteries, was read the second time, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Gantt presents a petition from Wm. O'Hara, late sheriff of Anne-Arundel county; referred to Messrs. Gantt, Estep and Speed.

The report of the committee on the communication of Ebenezer H. Cummins, was read the second time and dissented from.
