Whereas the government of the United States have authorised and effected a survey of different routs from the city of Baltimore to the city of Philadelphia, for the trans portation of the great northern mail: And whereas it is likely that the said government will subscribe for stock in some of the several road companies that have undertaken to open and perfect, respectively, different roads between Bahimore city and Philadelphia; therefore, Resolved, that should the government of the United States become a subscriber in any such company as afterszie, the state of Maryland hereby pledges its faith to become a subscriber likewise to the amount of ---- dollars for stock in such company.
