and mulattoes, and to alter and amend the laws concerning runaways, passed at December session 1824, chapter 171; also a bill, entitled. An act to secure to those persons who may apprehend absconding slaves or servants, the rewards offered by their masters, mistresses or owners.

Mr. Ridgaway reported a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act to alter and amend the constitution of this state, so that the governor may be elected by the people, and to abolish the council. And Mr. Stricker also reported a bill, entitled, An act to establish pilots and regulate their fees; which were severally read

and laid on the table.

Mr. Hope reported a bill, entitled, An act to extend to Thomas St. Clair, of Harford county, the benefit of an act passed February the eleventh eighteen hundred and twenty-two, chapter one hundred and fifty two, relating to public roads in the several counties therein mentioned. And Mr. Samuel R. Smith also reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Mary Hall, of Worcester county; which were severally twice read by special order and passed.

Mr. Tyson, chairman of the committee therein mentioned, delivered the following report, which was read and laid on the ta-

ble, viz.

The committee on internal improvement, in pursuance of an order of enquiry yesterday passed by the house of delegates, beg

leave to report the following resolution:

whereas, the government of the United States have authorised and effected a survey of different routs from the city of Baltimore to the city of Philadelphia, for the transportation of the great northern mail: And whereas, it is likely that the said government will subscribe for stock in some one of the several road companies that have undertaken to open and perfect respectively different roads between Baltimore city and Philadelphia, therefore, Resolved, That should the government of the United States become a subscriber in any such company as aforesaid, the state of Maryland hereby pledges its faith to become a subscriber likewise to the amount of dollars for stock in such company.
