

And Mr. Linthicum also reported a bill, entitled, An act to close up part of an old road, and make public in lieu thereof the new road therein mentioned; which were severally twice read by special order, and passed.

The clerk of the senate delivered a bill, entitled, An act to revive and extend the provisions of an act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Snow Hill in Worcester county, and for other purposes; which originated in, and being passed by the senate, was read, and referred to Messrs. Slemaker, Samuel R. Smith and Goldsborough.

Also, a report from the trustees of the Harford County Academy, made in conformity with a resolution of the general assembly, passed at their session of December, 1818; which, having been received and referred by the senate to the consideration of this house, was read and referred to the standing committee on public instruction. And the clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to alter the time for the transaction of equity business in the county courts of the first judicial district; also, the bill entitled, An act to change the name of John Cullember and Ann his wife, and Mary Ann his daughter, to that of Williams, and for other purposes; also, the bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the name of James Mills, of Dorchester county, to the name of James Applegarth; and the bill, entitled, An act to extend to Thomas St. Clair, of Harford county, the benefit of an act passed February the eleventh, eighteen hundred and twenty-two, chapter one hundred and fifty-two, relating to public roads in the several counties therein mentioned; which said bills, having likewise been severally passed by the senate, were ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Hawkins, leave of absence was granted to Mr. Millard.

On motion by Mr. Speed, Ordered, That the two committees of this house on the subject of the American Colonization Society, be consolidated.

Mr. Peach reported a bill, entitled, An act relative to public roads in Prince George's county.

Mr. Ridgely also reported a bill, entitled, An act to repeal part of an act, entitled, An act to appropriate certain lands to the use of the officers and soldiers of this state, and for the sale of vacant lands, passed at November session 1781.

Mr. John W. Thomas also reported a bill, entitled, An act authorising the governor and council of this state to appoint inspectors of salted fish for the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes.

Mr. Buchanan also reported a bill, entitled, An act to regulate the mode of granting divorces, and of ascertaining the nulli-
