

of Somerset county; which said bills were severally read and laid on the table.

On motion by Mr. Banning, the following order was read and laid on the table: Ordered, That the copies and abstracts of levy lists returned to this house by the clerks of the different counties of this state, be referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion by Mr. Peach, the following order was read and laid on the table: Ordered, That the clerks of the several county courts of this state, report to this house, at as early a day as practicable, the number of suits which have been instituted on the law dockets of each respective court since the passage of the act of assembly, entitled, An act to repeal certain acts of assembly relative to amerciements, and to lay a tax on plaintiffs who may institute suits at law in the several county courts of this state.

On motion by Mr. Tyson, the following resolution was read, and referred to the standing committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Samuel Davis, of Baltimore county, or to his order, during life, in quarterly annual payments, the half pay of a fifer, as a further remuneration of his services during the revolutionary war.

On motion by Mr. Sappington, the bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county courts of Frederick county, and for other purposes, which originated in, and passed the senate, was referred to Messrs. Sappington, Barnes, Tidball, Armstrong and Farquhar.

The clerk of the senate delivered a bill, entitled, An act relating to the removal of causes for trial to the third judicial district, which originated in, and being passed by, the senate, was read and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Compton and Kent. And returned the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Mary Hall, of Worcester county; which having been also passed by the senate, was ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to divorce Catherine Will, and her husband George Will, of Frederick county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Speed reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of certain minors therein mentioned; which was twice read by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Buchanan, the bill for the relief of Henrietta Maria Goldsborough, of Baltimore county, was made the order of the day for Wednesday next the tenth instant.

On motion by Mr. Montgomery, the bill relating to the levy court and commissioners of the tax for Harford county, was made the order of the day for Wednesday next the tenth instant.

On motion by Mr. Stricker, the bill relating to checks, inland bills of exchange, and promissory notes, was made the order of the day for Thursday the eleventh instant.

On motion by Mr. Buchanan, the bill, entitled, A supplement
