The bill reported by Mr. Done, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of the levy court of Somerset county, was read a second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Harlan, entitled, An act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Cecil county, was also read a second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Stricker, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Aisquith, the administrator of Robert C. Aisquith, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, was also read a second time, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Edward Hughes, entitled, An act to enlarge the powers of the trustees of the poor in Montgomery county, and for other purposes, was also read a second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. Tidball, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to release the tax upon the Hager's Town Academy Lottery, was made the order of the day for Monday next the 15th instant.

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
