Money counters have been weighing and counting the \$90,000,000 in gold, \$10,000,000 in silver and \$40,000,000 in bills stored at the United States Sub-Treasury, New York. ASSURING TRAITS OF THEIR UN-GAINLY AND STUPID BIRDS.

They Are Savage at Seasons—Diligent in Feeding Their Young—Waltz-Ing When Happy—A Domestic Slave.

The only redeeming feature in ostrich farming in Africa, says the *St. Joe's Gazette*, is the amusement to be got out of watching the ways of these weird, ugly, awkward, and brainless as are these birds when full-grown, there are few young animals prettier than an ostrich chick during the first few weeks of its life. It has a sleek, rounded body, large eyes, and a plump, round body. All its movements are comical, and there is an air of conceit and independence about the tiny creature which will scarcely allow itself to be touched by a hand.
