WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—The following is the full text of President Cleveland's letter of acceptance: WASHINGTON, Sept. 8, 1888. Hon. Patrick A. Collins and Others, Com-

It follows that a candidate for that high office can never forget that when the turmoil and the strife which attend the selection of its incumbent shall be heard no more, there must be in the quiet calm which follows a complete and solemn self-consecration by the people's chosen President of every faculty and endeavor to the service of a confiding and generous nation of freemen. These thoughts are intensified by the light of my experience in the presidential office, which has soberly impressed me with the severe responsibilities which it imposes, while it has quickened my love for American institutions and taught me the priceless value of the trust of my countrymen.
