Make a Display

The committee of the Eastern Shore Board of Development, which is to take into consideration the matter of an Eastern Shore exhibit at the Pan-American Exposition next year at Buffalo is to be announced by President Oswald Tilghman this week. This committee is to be composed of one representative citizen from each of the nine counties composing the Maryland Peninsula. As soon as the committee is organized an active campaign will be made in all the counties to the end, it is anticipated, that a creditable display of the diversified resources of the Peninsula be made at the Exposition, which gives promise of being one of the grandest ever held in this country.

Colonel Tilghman is giving close attention to the affairs of the new organization and he says he is very much encouraged with the prospects of making it all that its name implies. He writes: "I am convinced that the Eastern Shore can make a display at Buffalo that will be creditable and do more to attract home seekers and investors than any method I can conceive. No state can show more that will advertise than we. We can make an ever changing and fresh display commencing with berries and ending with wild ducks, terrapins and oysters."

Frequent meetings at the county seats are to be held under the auspices of the Board of Development when the aims and objects of the Board will be clearly set forth and the interest of the people fully aroused it is hoped.

The object of the Board as set forth in its constitution are: "The adoption of ways and means from time to time for the development of that portion of the State of Maryland called the Eastern Shore as a section presenting unrivalled advantages for residence and investment."

The officers of the Board are now at Easton.

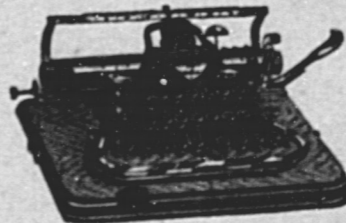
