PUBLIC LOCAL LAW.

To Establish a High School in Centreville.

CHAPTER 299.

AN ACT to authorize the conveyance and transfer of the property, money, funds, &c. of the Trustees of the Centreville Academy of Queen Anne's County to the Board of School Commissioners of said county for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a High School in said town of Centreville, in and for the Third Election District of said County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the body corporate, "The Trustees of the Centreville Academy of Queen Anne's County," be, and it is hereby authorized and empowered to grant and convey in fee simple and absolutely, all of its real and personal property, including the academy lot in the town of Centreville in said County, unto the body corporate, "The Board of School Commissioners of Queen Anne's County," and upon said conveyance, and in consideration thereof, and of the other provision of this act, "The Board of School Commissioners of Queen Anne's County" aforesaid, shall establish and maintain a High School in the said town of Centreville, in and for the Third Election District of said county, purchasing or erecting, obtaining a site therefor, and erecting a proper High School building thereon.

SECTION 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said body corporate, "The Trustees of the Centreville Academy of Queen Anne's County," be, and it is hereby further authorized and empowered, by an assignment, executed in duplicate, one copy thereof to be held by the Board of School Commissioners of Queen Anne's county aforesaid, and one copy to be filed in the office of the Comptroller of the Treasury of the State of Maryland, to transfer and assign unto the "Board of School Commissioners of Queen Anne's County," all of its real and personal property, including the academy lot, and every right, title, claim or demand, of, in, or upon any moneys, funds, donations or appropriations that the said body corporate, "The Trustees of the Centreville Academy of Queen Anne's County" may now or hereafter have or be entitled to under or by virtue of any resolutions or Acts of said General Assembly now or hereafter in force, or operation, or in any other manner whatsoever, and said assignment shall vest in said assignee say and every right, title, claim or demand to said moneys, funds donations or appropriations that said assignor may or might have or be entitled to, without the necessity of any necessary to obtain same, the warrants of said Comptroller, on the Treasurer of this State shall be drawn in favor of said assignee, therefore, as same become due and payable, and same shall be duly paid to said assignee and used to the extent thereof in the maintenance of said High School; and the said assignee shall furnish books to the same number of scholars in said High School, that the said assignor is now required, by law, to do in said Academy.

SECTION 3. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

172 A. That before a license shall be issued as hereinbefore provided the owner or possessor of the boat so desiring to use same in the taking, catching or capturing of Fish as aforesaid, shall make affidavit before the Clerk of said Circuit Court, authorized to issue the same, or before a Justice of the Peace of Queen Anne's county (in which latter case the Justice is authorized to issue the said license on receipt of a certificate of the said Justice of the Peace that such affidavit has been made before him) that he is at the time of making such affidavit, and has been for the twelve months preceding the taking thereof, a bona fide resident of Queen Anne's county, and that he will not employ or permit to be employed on or in the use of said boat so to be used in the taking, catching or capturing of Fish as aforesaid, any person who is not also a bona fide resident of Queen Anne's county and who has not been at least twelve months preceding the date of his employment.

173 A. That any owner or possessor of any boat who shall be found using the same in the waters of the Eastern Bay or its tributaries within the jurisdictional limits of Queen Anne's county without the authority of a license, first had and obtained as hereinbefore provided, in the taking, catching or capturing of Fish with any Seine, Fyke, Pound Net, Gill Net or any other contrivance now used or which may hereafter be invented for said purposes, together with a hook and line or whatsoever be found employed on or in the use of any boat (as aforesaid) used in taking, catching or capturing Fish by any person not being a bona fide resident of Queen Anne's county aforesaid, and such for twelve months preceding the date of his employment as aforesaid, shall be deemed to be a misdemeanor, and on conviction therefor before and by a Justice of the Peace of Queen Anne's county aforesaid, in the name of the State as Plaintiff, shall be punished with a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, and in case of failure or refusal to pay the same shall as part of said judgment forfeit the Boat and tackle and Seine, Fyke, Net or other contrivance so used as aforesaid and in addition thereto shall be committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding twenty days. In case the Justice of the Peace shall find it necessary, owing to the failure or refusal of the party so convicted as aforesaid, to pay said fine (and the costs of trial in addition thereto), to enforce the judgment of forfeiture against said boat, tackle, seine, gill net, pound net or other contrivance used in violating the provisions of this law, he shall order the constable making the seizure thereof to order forthwith proceed after ten days public notice by hand bills set up at two or more public places in the county near to the place where said boat, tackle, seine, net or other contrivance shall be, of the time, place manner and terms of sale, to sell the said boat and tackle, seine, pound net, gill net or other contrivances for cash to the highest bidder, and after paying out of the proceeds of said sale the costs attending the conviction, capture and sale as aforesaid, shall pay over the residue of said proceeds of sale, one half to the informer in the case and the other half to the county school commissioners for school purposes; provided however a right of appeal shall be granted to the next term of the Circuit Court of the county to any one feeling himself aggrieved by the judgment of the said Justice of the Peace. In case of an appeal the judgment of the Justice shall be stayed by the filing of a bond in double the amount of the fine to be taken in the name of the State and with security to be approved by the Justice of the Peace.

174 A. It shall be unlawful for any person to use a haul seine in any tributaries of the Eastern Bay within the jurisdictional limits of Queen Anne's county that is less than one hundred yards wide without the permission of the owner of the land bordering on same first had and obtained, and any one violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be fined not exceeding twenty dollars, and on failure or refusal to pay said fine, shall be committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding ten days or until fine and costs are paid.

175 A. It shall be the duty of the Deputy Commander of the Oyster Police force in the waters of the Eastern Bay in cases coming under his observation or information, to enforce this law with all the means at his command by the arrest of any person or persons violating its provisions, and by the seizure

SECTION 1. *And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County and the County Commissioners of Kent County, a majority of each board of said Commissioners, concurring, shall have full power and authority to make reasonable rules and regulations for the use of the public of all bridges which are the joint property of the said counties of Kent and Queen Anne's, and for the protection of said bridges and other property belonging thereto or therewith and to enforce the observance of said rules and regulations thus made, by imposing upon the party violating said rules and regulations, any reasonable fine, not exceeding ten dollars, for any violation of said rules and regulations, which fines shall be collected as small debts are now collected, and shall be recovered in the name of the County Commissioners of said counties before any Justice of the Peace of either of said counties in which the party violating such rules and regulations shall be found, and on failure or refusal to pay any fine imposed under this law, or inability to collect the same by legal process, the party so fined may be committed to the County jail of the County for a period not exceeding ten days, in the same manner as commitments are made for fines imposed by the Circuit Courts of this State, or conviction for misdemeanors, and the Justice of the Peace shall make this a part of his judgment, and said fines shall be applied to the keeping of said bridges in repair.

SECTION 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
