

PROTECTION RUN MAD.

... fight was made against... duty on Monday in the Senate. In the general discussion of the tariff bill. Paragraph 137 was reached and the pent-up energies of Democratic oratory were loosed. He produced protests and affidavits, and quoted extended statements from leading manufacturers both East and West denouncing the proposed increase of duty as an unnecessary burden. The people of Pittsburg declared, said Senator Vest, that this part of the McKinley bill is a fraud to force the use of iron plate instead of tin, and he declared that in principle this paragraph was nothing short of "protection run mad."

But the principal speech upon the subject was delivered by Senator Wilson from Maryland. He attacked the subject with vigor, and conclusively proved that any increase of duty on tin-plate was an imposition upon the consumer, as well as a menace to the canned-goods and other industries.

In opening the argument Senator Wilson showed that the proposed increase of duty was virtually a prohibitory tariff upon an article of general consumption. There is no novel so poor that it does not have some article of tinware in hourly or daily use. On the other hand, no mansion is so lordly that it outgrows the use of similar articles. To the farmer, miner, lumberman, to the inhabitant of the rural village as well as the great city, tin-plate in some form is an article of daily necessity. Hence, to tax America's millions of people upon such an article in the selfish interests of the iron plate manufacturers is "protection run mad" for a fact.

But Senator Wilson also showed that the increased duty on tin-plate is so intimately associated with various industries in Maryland that they will feel the burden severely. And in this part of his argument the Senator proved that the capital invested in these enterprises is as great and as worthy of consideration as any which may be invested in the tin-plate industry. To single out these specific industries located in Maryland and elsewhere and tax them nearly \$9,000,000 a year on the problematic theory that in so doing a new enterprise would be built up in the country was a most remarkable course to pursue.

Senator Wilson's argument lacked nothing of cogency and logical force, and its eloquence of facts would certainly have convinced any body of men not blinded by selfish partisan interests and confirmed in a policy as illogical as it is wrong in principle.

Mr. Vest says the Democrats will discuss every item of the tariff bill, and demand the yeas and nays, unless prevented by force. A special force bill to control that voting will be the next movement.
