COLORED MEN OF AFFLUENCE

Wonderful Progress Made by the Colored Race in Ten Years.
The facts are, the colored race has made enormous strides in the past ten years, getting during the past decade, in the City of Washington, a city in which the population of 23 years ago was only a dozen free blacks, a colored merchant tailor who has a business of \$350,000 a year. He has a slave, and followed Sherman's troops on their march to the sea. When he reached Charleston his possessions were a suit of very ragged clothes and 28 cents.

The present Tax Collector of the District of Columbia, himself a colored man, pays taxes on \$250,000. New York had a colored druggist who died recently leaving \$1,000,000, and a son-in-law worth \$150,000. The ex-United States Minister to Hayti has \$75,000. Less than one hundred colored men in Pittsburg pay taxes on a combined property valuation of \$2,500,000.

Cincinnati has a colored furniture dealer whose check is good any day for \$100,000. Twenty-three years ago he was a Kentucky slave. The late Robert Gordon owned more than a score of four-story residences at the time of his death. One day he entered a Cincinnati bank and asked for government bonds.
