Chicago's City Council has passed an ordinance taxing bicycles one dollar a year. It is estimated that there are in use 300,000 wheels, and the money thus obtained is to be expended for improved pavements.

The adoption of similar measures in other cities has been urged as a means of securing better paved CATTLE, streets, without expense to the taxpayers. In nearly all cases, however, the suggestion came from persons who did not want to be taxed themselves, and who argued that, as the bicyclist wanted smooth riding, he ought to pay for it.

This proposition would be logical enough if wheelmen alone used the public thoroughfares, and all other vehicles were excluded; but it is obviously unfair as long as the sceed enjoys no special privilege.
