a full text of the local option law for this district, which was recently passed by the legislature. The law is sweeping in its territory to say the least, but the following amendment would be found beneficial, as with it added, violators would be few:

"Provided, that any person who Shall import, buy or barter, directly or indirectly, for his, her or other use, any beverage stronger than water, shall on conviction before any justice of the peace or the circuit court of said county, be fined not less than one dollar nor more than one thousand, and for failure to pay said fine and costs to be imprisoned in county jail a day for each dollar, fine and costs. And for the second offence, be sent to the House of Correction for not less than six months nor more than twenty-five years. And for the third or last offence, be imprisoned in the penitentiary for life or death on the gallows, or both in the discretion of Dyspepsia Cure the Governor pot be allowed to com-


