The Republican boast of ability to carry New York is the best indication of Democratic victory, since it appears to be made as a defense against Democratic confidence. The latter grows out of a careful analysis of conditions and a review of the rapidly dwindling Republican pluralities of recent years. New York cannot control the Democratic party, but those Electoral votes count.

Monday's dispatches brought news of a series of lawless assaults upon negroes. In Indian Territory a store built by a negro was blown up with dynamite; in Texas a negro was hanged by a mob; in Indiana a negro was whipped with barbed wire by whitecaps, and in Illinois a negro boy was lynched and the tents of negro bridge builders were burned, while their occupants were shot into the woods. As only one of these affairs out of four occurred in a Southern State, northern critics will hardly find their usual stereotyped comments available.

One hundred years ago the United States acquired, through the Louisiana Purchase, a vast territorial domain. To commemorate this notable event a World's Fair will be held at St. Louis next year. The buildings and grounds of this Exposition were dedicated at St. Louis Thursday with impressive ceremonies. The President of the United States and the only living ex-President were the orators of the occasion. Governors of the States, including the Maryland Executive and the commissioners from this state, participated in the dedicatory exercises and in the celebration of the centennial of the Louisiana Purchase. The acquisition of this enormous stretch of territory, which has an area of 875,000 square miles and a population today of 15,000,000, was one of the greatest achievements of American statesmanship. It was fitting that Maryland, which played so conspicuous a part in the Revolution by which the United States became the dominant power in the Western Hemisphere, should be represented in the celebration at St. Louis Thursday. President Roosevelt and ex-President Cleveland, in their addresses at St. Louis enlarged upon the importance from an economic and political standpoint of the acquisition of the territory included in the Louisiana Purchase.
