The Government of the United States is spending \$20,000 for the propagation of lobsters. There are sections, however, where the lobster flourishes luxuriantly without Government aid.

Washington dispatches says the postoffice physicians are to be discharged and the office abolished. The chaplain attached to the Post office Department should by all means be left undisturbed. His services are badly needed.

A Columbus justice has fined a barber who administered a scalp renovating remedy for practicing medicine without a license. If he had fined him for practicing surgery when he shaved a man the whole State would have applauded.

We are told that seven women were carried on the pay rolls of the Wash Postoffice as "cleaners." They never worked; there was no work for them to do. There is work there for 700 "cleaners" now. But they ought to be men who have worked in a fish-scrap fertilizer factory.

It is reported that Postmaster General Payne is about to retire on account of "impaired health." If Mr. Payne should conclusively prove to the country the fact of physical illness, his abandonment of the post, notwithstanding the fact that he is under 40, would not be a proper subject of comment. If the ill health is a make believe, it is by far the most momentous incident of the department scandals, and his retirement would amount to a confession by the Administration of weakness, incapacity and insincerity.

Delaware has had a lynching, the first since the war. An armed guard and steel doors did not deter the mob in their determination to wreak vengeance upon the wretch whom they sought. The deed was approved by thousands of people, who, by their presence showed that they were in sympathy with the mob. The death noted out was as horrible as could be conceived, victim being burned alive at the stake. The crime was most horrible of recent history, and the victim made a full confession. The court had refused to take immediate action and it held to be largely responsible for the disgrace which all ways follows such unchristian outbursts.

The postal scandals that are now stirring up the Government of Washington and elsewhere are a striking manifestation of the spirit of the age and the spirit of the age is "graft" or "rake-off," as it is variously called. It pervades every mark society. The man who has a trust wants to get something out of it. Men are not satisfied with the legitimate emoluments of their places. If the butter is sent to market to buy provisions for the family the chances are that it demands a "rake-off" from the butcher and the green grocer. Not long ago it was shown to be a practice in New York for the grocer to give Christmas presents to servant in rich families, for the harness maker and the coachmaker to give Xmas presents to the coachman. Agent who have ordered to give often improve the opportunity to exact a percentage. But in dealing with the Government the "graft" comes more conspicuous into use. If a man invents some appliance the use which will save the Government perhaps millions of dollars he may be compelled to pay some official a sum of money to get him interested. The recent disclosures about a mail-pouch contract are an illustration of one method of "graft." A contractor gets 50c. for a pouch but the Government pays a dollar. The difference represents the "graft" which is said to go to the man who gives the order. A clerk is illegally promoted to a place which has a large salary than that which he has been getting. He pays a part of the increased salary to the man who procures the promotion.






