profits of any office, held by any other person during his acting in his office of governor, senator, delegate to Congress or affembly, or member of the council, or the profits, or any part of the profits arising on any agency, for the sup-

ply of clothing or provisions for the army or navy."

39. "That if any fenator, delegate of the affembly, or member of the council, shall shold or execute any office of profit, or receive directly or indirectly, at any time, the profits or any part of the profits of any office exercised by any other person, during his acting as senator, delegate of the assembly, or, member of the council, his seat, on conviction in a court of law, by the oath of two cregible witnesses, shall be word, and he shall suffer the punish. ment for wilful and corrupt perjury, or be banished this state for ever, or disquantied for ever from holding any office or place of trust or profit, as the court may adjudge.

That the chancellor, all judges, the attorney-general, clerks of the general court, the clerks of the county court, the regitter of the land-office, and the register of wills, shall hold their commissions during good behaviour,

removable only for misbehaviour, on conviction in a court of law.

41. "That there be a regitter of wills appointed for each county, who shall be commissioned by the governor,on the joint recommendation of the senate and house of delegates, and that upon the death, resignation, difqualification, or removal out of the county, by any regitter of wills in the recess of the general afternaly, the governor, with the aivice of the council, may appoint and commission a fit and proper person to such vacant office, to hold the

fame until the meeting of the general aftembly.

42. "That therms shall be elected annually in each county by ballet, that is to say, two persons for the office of theriff for each county, the one of whom having the majority of votes, or if both have an equal number, either of them, at the discretion of the governor, to be commissioned by the governor for the said office; no person to conunue in the said office more than three successive years, or be capable of being again el cted during four years afterwards: bond with iccurity to be taken every year as usual, and no sheriff shall be qualified to act before the same is given. In case of death, retusal, refignation, disqualification, or removal out of the county, before the expiration of the year, the other person choich as aforefaid, inali be commissioned by the governor to execute the said office for luch residue of the year as shall be unexpired; the faid person giving bond with security as aforesaid, and in case of his death, related, relignation, disqualineation, or removal out of the county, before the expiration of the year, the governor, with the advice of his council, may nominate and commission a sit and proper person to execute the said office for fuch refidue or the year as thall be then unexpired; the faid person giving bond and security as aforefaid; the election shall be held at the same time and place appointed for the election of delegates, and the justices there summoned to attend for the preservation of the peace shall be judges thereof, and of the qualification of candidates, who shall appoint a cierk to take the balots: all freemen above the age of twenty-one years, having a freehold of fit; acres of land in the county in which they offer to ballot, and reliding therein, and all freemen above the age of theaty one years, and having property in the state above the value of thirty pounds current money, and raving resided in the county in which they offer to ballot one whole year next preceding the election, thall have a right of tuffrage; no person to be eligible to the office of theref for a county but an inhabitant of the faid county, above the age of twenty-one years, and naving real and personal property in the state above the value the just ces atorefaid that examine the ballots, and the two candidates properly qualified, having in each c unty the majority of legel ballots, that be declared duly elected for the office of sheriff for fuch county, and returned to the governor and council, with a certificate of the number of ballots for each of them.

43 " That the judges of the general court and junious of the county courts may appoint the clerks of their respective courts, and in case of reinfal, death, renguation, disqualification, oreremoval out of the state, of the cie k of the general court, in the vacation of the faid court; and in case of the reliant, death, relignation, disqualinea int, or removations of the county of any of the faid county clerks in the vacation of the county court of which he is clerk, the gevernor with the advice of the council may appoint and commission a fit and proper person to such vacant onice respectively, to hold the fame until the meeting of the next general court or country court, as

44. " I'not the governor for the time being, with the advice and confent of the council, may appoint the chancellor, and all judges and junious, the attorney general, naval officers, officers in the regular land and fea fervice, officers of the mittie, registers of the land office, turveyers, and all other civil officers of government (affessors, constables and: overfeers offethe roads only excepted) and may also suspend or semove any civil officer who has not a commillion during good behaviour, and may suspend any militia efficer for one month, and may also suspend or remove any regular efficer in the land or i a tervices, and the governor may remove or suspend any militia officer in pursuance of the judgment of a court martials.
