## CONVENTION PROCEEDINGS of the

## T U R D A September 14, Υ,

CONVENTION met. All members present as on yesterday, except Mr. Gilpin, Mr. Ewing, Mr. Brevard, Mr. T. Wright, Mr. Kent, Mr. Goldsborough, and Mr. Marbury. The proceedings of

yesterday were read.

It being represented to this Convention, that in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-three, an act of affembly passed, directing the justices of Talbot county to levy on the inhabitants of that county forty-five pounds of tobacco per tax, to be paid at three annual payments, for the purposes of purchasing land and building a house thereon for the reception of the poor of that county: that in cont quence thereof there was levied at November court seventeen hundred and seventy-sour, the quantity of fincen pounds of tobacco per poll, which has been collected and paid into the hands of trustees appointed to carry, the said act into execution, and there remains unexpended. That at November court seventeen hundred and seventyfive, the further fum of fifteen pounds of tobacco was levied by the judices of the faid county, now to be collected by the sheriff, which cannot at this sine be done without dutressing the inhabitants thereof:

RESOLVED therefore, That the sheriff of Talbot county shall forbear to collect any or the tobacco so levied on the inhibitants of that county at November court seventeen hundred and seventy-nive, and that the trustees appointed for carrying the said act of assembly into execution, are hereby requested to pay all money or tobacco which they may have received or shall hereafter receive in virtue of the said act, into the hands of the trustees of the said county, to be applied by them to the re icf and support of the poor of the said county.

Mr. Hughs brings in and delivers to Mr. Prelident the following report, to wit:

"Your committee to enquire into the expenditure of the money appropriated for the building a log gaol in Frederick county, beg leave to report, That one hundred and seventy-nine pounds five shillings and twopence farthing has been expended on the same, as per account ten cred to your committee; and that there remains in the hands of the supervisors of the said building the sum of twenty pounds sourteen shillings and nine pence three farthings. That the jog gool is compliance in recaste to the direction of a resolve in December last all to three stoves. Your committee are a option that the said log gool is by no means proper for the reception of prisoners of war, having no yard or other necessary convenience; all which is submitted to the honourable house.

"Signed by order of the committee, Which was read and ordered to lie on the caple.

Agreeable to the order of the day the Convention took into confideration the report relative to the conduct of Isac Costin, and after hearing the evidence produced, as well against as in behalf of the said Isac Costin, were of opinion, that he hath she wed himself inimical to the case of American freedom; therefore RESOLVED, That the said Isaac Cottin enter into cond with good security to the president of this Convention, in the penalty of two hundred pounds common money, for his future good behaviour, and thereupon be discharged on paying the charges of his profecution.
