As the establishing a bill of rights and the formation of a new government on the authority of the people only, are matters of the utmost importance to the good people of this state, and their posterity; and as the bill of rights and form of government reported to this Convention by the committee chosen for that purpose, have been reterred for conside ation to Monday the thirtieth instant, occasioned by the necessary attendance in Congress of several of the representatives of the people; in order therefore that the full st consideration may be had thereon,

RESOLVED, That the faid bill of rights and form of government be immediately printed for the confideration of the people at large, and that twelve copies thereof be sent without delay to each county in this state.

The previous question was called for by Mr. Gustavus Scott, and put, whether the above question be now put? Resolved in the affirmative.
