such persons as shall be absent on the public business of the United States, or this flite, and shall be elect. ed by the electors of the senate when assembled to elect schat its in the year seventeen hundred and nine. sy-fix, and for ever thereafter by the electors of the senate when so assembled; and the said election of the council shall be inade in the some manner as the election of fenctors, and no person stall be capable of afting as a member of the council longer than ton years fuccessively: And if any perfor elected a member of the council fliall refuse to act, die, refigu, or remove out of the flate, during the receis of the general assembly, the members thereof, immediately thereupon, or at their next meeting thereafter, shall elect, by ballot, another person, quahified as aforefaid, in his place, until the meeting of the general affembly; and in the first week of the felfrom the faid vacancy shall be supplied as follows, to wit: The house of delegates shall, by ballot, appoint nine of their body then present, and the said nine, or a majority of th m, shall, by ballot, nominate to the fen ite three qualified persons, and out of such nomination the fenate shall elect one person, by ball it, to fill the vacancy for the refidue of the five years; and if any member of the council, or the person so elected, shall refule to all, die, refign, or remove out of the state, during the sitting of the general assembly, such vacancy shall be filled up in like manner; and if during the recess of the general assembly, such vacancy shall be filled up by the members of the council in manner aforefaid, until the next meeting of the general affembly, and, in such case, the field vacance shall be filled up in manner aforesaid, and so tetice aveties whenever a vacancy shall happen it shall be filled up so herein before directed.
