

22. In case any of the said witnesses, when so as aforesaid summoned, shall not attend, the commissioners, or any two of them, shall apply to the clerk of the county for an attachment, which shall be issued accordingly, to compel their attendance.—*ibid.* § 3.

23. In all cases where the same tract is held by different persons, and lies partly in one county and partly in another, or partly in this state and partly in an adjoining state, any person interested may have a commission, on application to the county court, to fix, mark, and bound the whole tract, when lying partly in one county and partly in another, and also of his particular part; and when any tract shall lie partly in this state, and partly in an adjoining state, any citizen of this, or any of the United States, may have a commission, on application as aforesaid, to mark and bound such part as shall lie within this state, under the regulations of the original act to which this is a supplement; and in such cases the party or parties so applying shall derive equal benefit from the return and recording his or their commissions, as if such tract had been wholly in one county, or wholly in this state.—*ibid.* § 4.

B R I B E R Y.

i. **I**F any person shall give any bribe, present or reward, or any promise, or any security for the payment or delivery of any money, or any other thing, to obtain or procure a vote, to be governor, senator, delegate to congress or assembly, member of the council, or judge, or to be appointed to any of the said offices, or to any office of profit or trust, now created or hereafter to be created in this state, the person giving and the person receiving the same, on conviction in a court of law, shall be forever disqualified to hold any office of trust or profit in this state.—*Const.* 54.—See *Inspectors*; 8.
