And shall be deemed and adjudged in all courts of law, and in the court of equity and orphans' courts, the current money of the state, and shall be received as such in payment of all debts, covenants, contracts, promises and agreements, at the value above expressed, except in the settlement of deceased persons estates, where the appraisements were made, or the estates accounted for in dollars at six shillings. —Nov. 1781, c. 16. § 1. *Cont. 10 Oel. 20, 1798.*

5. All judgments and decrees, appraisements of the estate of any deceased person, and all penalties, fines, and forfeitures, shall only be rendered, given, made or imposed, in current money, at the rate and value aforesaid; and all mortgages, judgments, debts, covenants, contracts, promises or agreements, heretofore made for sterling money, may be discharged in any gold or silver coin above mentioned, at the rate of 166l. 13 4 current money for 100l. sterling. —*ibid.* § 2.

6. Provided nothing contained shall be taken to repeal any part of the act for calling out of circulation the quota of this state of the bills of credit, issued by congress, and the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly under the old government, and by the resolves of convention. —*ibid.* § 3.

## C O L L E C T O R S.

1. **T**H E several collectors shall have the following fees, (for which see the act) and no more. But one half of the said fees only, shall be taken for vessels built or purchased by inhabitants of this province, whose owners are all actual residents therein. —1717, c. 2, § 3.

2. Collectors shall put up a fair table of their fees in their several offices under penalty of 50l. sterling, one half to the support of government, the other to the informer. —*ibid.* § 4.

3. The governor and council shall draw orders on the justices of the respective counties, payable to the collectors of the United States, allowing to each the sum of 1d. for every hoghead of tobacco inspected in virtue of this act, and shipped from his respective district; the said order to be drawn for such sum of money as the said sum of 1d. may amount to, calculating the said sum of 1d. for every hoghead inspected in the said county,
