COUNCIL, CLERK OF THE

1. **H**IS appointment, see *governor and council*, art. 2.

2. The clerk of the council shall, within the space of 3 days after the receipt of the laws and resolutions, and of the votes and proceedings, from the printer, endorse each packet thereof for public service, and subscribe his name, and shall deliver the same to the sheriff of Anne Arundel county, to be forwarded as is hereinafter mentioned, (See *letters public*, art. 7) and shall take his receipt for the same, under the penalty of 20l. current money for every refusal or neglect—1790, c. 51, § 4.

3. The clerk of the council shall charge one shilling and ten pence half penny for each commission (under the act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state) and the said fee to be paid by the person accepting the same—*Resol.* 1793.

COUNTIES.

1. **A**NNE-ARUNDEL County erected—1650, c. 8.

2. The bounds of St. Mary's and Charles counties, and between Talbot and Kent counties, are settled, and a new county erected by the name of Prince George's.—1695, c. 13. The same divisions are confirmed.—1704, c. 92, § 1, 2.

3. The bounds and limits of Anne-Arundel and Baltimore counties are settled by the act of 1698, c. 13—but so much of that act as relates to the south side of Patapsco river, being added to Baltimore county, is repealed by 1726, c. 1.

4. Every county lying on any navigable river, shall extend its jurisdiction from the shore to the channel of the river, and be divided from
