C O U R T H O U S E S.

1. **F**OR the fundamental rights of the several counties to their court-house lands, see the act empowering the justices to purchase lands for the use of their respective court-houses.—1697, c. 5.

2. Purchases of lands, made according to the act of 1697, c. 5. and recorded in the several county courts, to which they properly belong, shall be a perpetual bar against the persons from whom purchased, and against all claimants under them.—1704, c. 76, §. 1, 2.
