9. In case it should happen, that in the election of representatives, two or more persons may have an equal number of votes, and in the election of electors residents of the Western shore, six or more persons residing on that shore may have an equal number of votes, and in the election of electors residents of the Eastern shore, four or more persons residing on that shore may have an equal number of votes; the governor and council shall determine by lot, from the candidates, who shall be the representatives, and in the same manner from the candidates for electors residing on the Western and Eastern shores respectively, having an equal number of votes as aforesaid, who shall be the electors for the said shore --- *ibid.* § 13.

10. If a vacancy or vacancies shall happen in the representation of this state in the house of representatives in congress, by death, resignation, disqualification or otherwise, the governor and council shall issue writs of election to the district where such vacancy shall happen, to fill the same in the manner hereinbefore prescribed.--- *ibid.* § 14.

11. In case any of the elections held in consequence of this act, shall be at a different time from that on which the elections shall be held for delegates to the general assembly, the sheriffs of the respective counties, and the commissioners of Baltimore-town, shall have the same allowance for holding the elections under this act, as by law is given to them for holding the election for delegates to the general assembly, and which said allowance shall be paid in the same manner as the allowance for holding the elections for delegates to the general assembly.--- *ibid.* § 15.

12. Provided this state should be entitled to 9 members in the next house of representatives of the United States, it shall be divided into 8 districts in the following order, to wit:—Saint Mary's, Charles, and Calvert counties, shall be the 1; Prince George's and Anne-Arundel counties, including Annapolis, the 2; Montgomery county, and that part of Frederick county adjacent, as far as Monocacy, from the mouth thereof to the Pennsylvania line, the 3; the remainder of Frederick county, Washington and Allegany counties, the 4; Baltimore town, and Baltimore and Harford counties, the 5; Cecil, Kent, and Queen-Anne's counties, the 6; Caroline, Talbot, and Dorchester counties, the 7; and Somerset and Worcester counties, the 8, districts.—1791, c. 62, § 1.

13. Provided this state should be entitled to no more than 8 members as aforesaid, it shall be divided into 8 districts, to wit:—the first four shall remain as in the preceding clause, Baltimore town and Baltimore county shall be the fifth; Harford, Cecil and Kent counties, the sixth; Queen-Anne's,
