

execution of the act for the speedy conveyance of public letters and packets, and for other purposes—1790, c. 51, § 15.

28. The governor and council shall draw orders on the treasurer of the western shore for all salaries of the civil officers fixed by law, and payable by the said treasurer; for all accounts passed by the auditor general, against this state, and approved by the executive, which may have arisen due by any existing law of this state; and for any sum of money not exceeding 500l. that may be necessary to pay the expences and incidental charges of government; and the treasurer is hereby directed to lay before the next general assembly ensuing, such expenditure, a particular account of all monies paid by him to the orders of the governor and council, under this resolution, to defray the incidental expences of government.—*Resol.* 1794.

29. The governor and council shall cause to be transmitted to the register of the land office, and to the examiner for the eastern shore, certified copies of such rules and orders as are now, and which may be hereafter made and established for the direction and government of land offices, and for the conduct of the treasurer in issuing titlings or orders for warrants, and for the observance of the said examiner and register in their respective offices, and for the behaviour of surveyors.—1795, c. 61, § 8.

30. The governor and council shall cause the arms, and all other military articles now in the armoury at Annapolis, to be removed to the armoury at Frederick town, and the salary of the armourer of the city of Annapolis shall be discontinued.—*Resol.* 1795.

31. The governor and council shall, from time to time, cause blank marriage licences to be printed and delivered to the respective treasurers, so as to keep them provided with a sufficient number for the use of the several counties of this state, in every year hereafter—1797, c. 38, § 6.

32. The governor and council shall be requested to procure annually 22 copies of the laws of congress, for the use of the several courts of law and equity in this state, one copy whereof shall be transmitted to the register in chancery, one to the clerks of the general court for the western and eastern shores respectively, and one to the clerk of each county court; and shall draw on the treasurer for as much money as will defray the expence of the same.—*Resol.* 1797.
