

14. All inspectors shall, on the 2d day of the court of laying the assessment for their respective counties, account with the justices thereof, upon oath or affirmation, for all monies received, or which ought to be received, by them, by virtue of this act, in which account they shall be allowed for necessary disbursements, in pursuance of this act.—*ibid.* § 25.

15. The property of the scales, ropes, blocks, branding and marking irons and weights, belonging to any warehouse established by this act, shall be so far vested in the inspector or inspectors for the time being, as to punish any trespass or felony thereof—*ibid.* § 26.

17. Where two inspectors, in the same inspection, cannot agree to pass any hoghead of tobacco, and a review shall be afterwards required, and such hoghead, or any part thereof, shall be by such reviewers adjudged unmerchantable, and burnt agreeably to the directions of this act, in such case, the inspector who was against first passing such tobacco, shall not be burthened with making satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, but in such case, the inspector who would have passed the same shall make satisfaction for the whole; and where any tobacco, on review, shall be adjudged unmerchantable, the inspector or inspectors who passed such tobacco, shall immediately pay the owner one other hoghead of the same weight and quality, and thereupon the note for the tobacco adjudged unmerchantable as aforesaid, shall be delivered up to be destroyed; and if the inspector or inspectors shall refuse or neglect, he or they shall be answerable for the full value of the tobacco, at the price thereof at the time; and the inspector or inspectors, or his or their bonds, with his or their sureties, may be sued, at the election of the party; and every inspector shall deliver the identical hoghead of tobacco expressed in the note, and no other, to the person holding the same, under the penalty of 5*l.* current money; and no person shall receive any other hoghead than that for which the note is given, in lieu of the same, under the penalty of 5*l.* current money, except only in the case where the tobacco, for which the note is given, shall, on review, be adjudged unmerchantable.—*ibid.* § 29.

18. No inspector or inspectors shall hereafter, on any pretence, give out any note for tobacco, unless he or they shall have actually received and passed the full quantity of tobacco for which such note shall be given, under the penalty of 30*l.* current money for every such offence.—*ibid.* § 30.

19. When any tobacco shall be brought in parcels to any warehouse in this state, the inspector or inspectors are hereby directed carefully to view and examine the same, and if found to be sound, clear of trash,
