

deliver separate manifests for the hogheads intended to be put on board each vessel; which manifest or manifests every master is required to produce to, and lodge with, the collector of the district where the vessel, whereof he is master, shall ride, or by whom he shall be cleared out, some time before her clearance; and as it may happen that the vessel, in which such tobacco was intended to be put, may be so full as not to be capable of stowing all the tobacco contained in such manifest, or by springing a leak, or other accident, it may be necessary to re-land the same, in such cases it shall and may be lawful to ship the said tobacco, or any part thereof, on board any other vessel the owner thereof shall think fit, or if there be no vessels to receive the said tobacco, then it shall and may be lawful for the master of the first mentioned vessel to put the said tobacco in the nearest warehouse to the place where such vessel shall ride, and the inspector or inspectors of the warehouse where such tobacco shall be delivered, shall receive, from the person re-landing the same, 2s current money for every hoghead so landed, and shall give a receipt for the same, and shall cause the said tobacco to be safely lodged and delivered to the owner, or his order, when required, without any other fee or reward; and one half of the money so received shall be paid to the owner of the warehouse, and the other half may be retained by the inspector or inspectors for his or their trouble.—*ibid.*

## § 34.

21. If any hoghead of tobacco shall be brought to any warehouse for inspection, and the inspector or inspectors shall refuse to pass the same, and the owner or other person bringing such tobacco, will undertake to pick and separate the good from the bad, the said inspector or inspectors shall allow the use of one or more of their prizes for prizing such tobacco so separated and repacked in the said hoghead; and if there shall be several hogheads of tobacco belonging to several owners, to be picked, repacked and prized, at any public warehouse, the owner, or other person bringing the same, whose tobacco shall be first examined and refused, shall be first permitted to make use of such prize or prizes, and the same rule shall be observed in the prizing all tobacco which shall be picked, &c. as aforesaid.—*ibid.* § 39.

22. No inspector or inspectors shall take or convert to his or their own use, or otherwise dispose of, any draughts or samples of tobacco drawn out of any hoghead, but the same if fit to pass, shall be carefully returned and replaced under the penalty of 5s current money.—*ibid.* § 40.

23. The justices of the county courts shall hear and determine all complaints against any inspector, in a summary way, and if found guilty of any breach of duty required by this act, they shall remove any such inspector, and immediately after transmit a copy of the complaint, and of their proceedings thereon to the governor and the council; and if the inspector shall think himself injured by the judgment of removal,

he
