

26. The inspectors of tobacco at the several warehouses, shall, on the delivery of every hoghead of tobacco at the warehouse whereof they are inspectors, weigh and give a receipt for such tobacco, if required by the proprietor, or person bringing the same to the said warehouse, expressing therein that the same is for uninspected tobacco, which receipt shall be given up to the inspectors, upon the said tobacco's being inspected, and before the inspectors shall be obliged to deliver notes therefor.—*ibid.*

27. For every hoghead of tobacco inspected on the western shore, except the counties of Baltimore and Harford, there shall be paid to the inspector or inspectors, the sum of 4s. current money; and for every hoghead of tobacco inspected on the eastern shore, and Baltimore county 5s. by the person receiving the said tobacco, at the time of the delivery thereof; and the said inspectors shall account for and pay all such monies, by them received to the justices of their county, who shall, out of such monies, pay the proprietors of the warehouses, within one month after such account shall be settled, a sum of money not exceeding 1s. 6d. nor less than 1s. 3d. current money, for every hoghead inspected, packed and lodged in their respective warehouses, and the inspectors salaries, and all other expences incurred in virtue of this act.—*ibid.* § 60.

28. The inspector or inspectors appointed for the warehouses to be erected at Frederick and Washington counties, shall take an oath or affirmation as the case may be, as in other cases is required by this act, and shall give bond, with security to be approved by the said justices, to be recorded in the county court for the faithful performance of his trust.—*ibid.* § 67.

29. The inspectors in the said counties of Frederick and Washington, shall be subject to the same rules and regulations as herein before directed and shall receive 2s. 6d. for every hoghead of tobacco inspected at, and delivered from, their respective warehouse, from the person to whom delivered.—*ibid.* § 71.

31. The several inspectors shall hereafter receive 20s. current money for every hoghead of transfer tobacco by them packed, prized and coopered, as a full compensation therefor.—1790, c. 55, § 6.

32. Nothing in this act is meant or intended to prevent any person or persons in the counties of Frederick, Washington and Allegany, from carrying their tobacco to any public warehouse for inspection, fixed upon navigable water, within this state.—*ibid.* § 10.
