Every inspector shall attend at the warehouse under his charge on every day from the 1 day of May to the 20 day of Sept. except on Sundays, the 4 day of July, the holidays observed at Whitsuntide, and days of musters of the militia, for the receiving, inspecting and delivering any tobacco brought to and delivered at the warehouse of which he is inspector between the 1 day of May and the 20 day of Sept. but he shall not take charge of or inspect any tobacco brought to his warehouse for inspection between the 20 day of Sept. and 1 day of Nov. and he shall attend on every day, Sundays and days of muster of the militia excepted, for the delivery of tobacco, between the 20 day of Sept. and the 1 day of Nov. and he shall attend as often as he shall be required from the 1 day of Nov. to the 1 day of May, during the continuance of this act, except on Sundays and the holidays at Christmas and Easter, and days of musters of the militia, for inspecting and delivering tobacco.—1793, c. 47, § 6.

35. Nothing in this act, which regulates the attendance of inspectors at their respective warehouses, shall be construed to repeal, or in any manner affect the 17th § of the act of 1789, to which this is a further supplement.—*ibid.* § 9.

36. Nothing in this act shall be construed to extend to Baltimore, Montgomery, Frederick, Talbot, Worcester, Dorchester, Caroline, Queen-Anne's, Kent, Somerset, and Saint Mary's counties.—*ibid.* § 10.

The several inspectors appointed in virtue of this act are required, when tobacco in hogheads shall be brought to him or them for inspection which shall not be clear of trash, but shall be in good order and merchantable only, to give a receipt therefor, expressing the number, gross, tare and net weight of the same, and that the tobacco is of the second quality, and shall also mark the No. gross, tare and net weight thereof on the head and bilge of the hoghead, and the said receipt shall be obligatory on the said inspector or inspectors for a delivery of the said tobacco, in the same manner and conditions as any note issued by him or them in virtue of the several acts for the inspection of tobacco.—1795, c. 71, § 3.

38. The said receipts shall not be a tender for the payment of any tobacco contract, unless the said contract shall have been for tobacco of the second quality.—*ibid.* § 4.
