The two inspectors at the Centre new George-town warehouse, shall be appointed at the time and manner as inspectors are by the said last mentioned act, and shall be subject to the same rules and regulations; and shall have salaries to be paid and ascertained as inspectors salaries are to be ascertained and paid by law; and in the stamping the hogheads of tobacco passed at the said warehouse at George-town, the words Centre new George-town, shall be stamped or marked thereon.—*ibid.* §. 6.

I N S P E C T O R S N O T E S.

1. THE inspector or inspectors who shall pass any tobacco, shall deliver as many printed notes, under their hands, to the owner, and in his name, as shall be required, in which note or receipt shall be expressed the place and time of reception, the maker's mark, the warehouse number, and the gross, tare, and net weights, for all tobacco inspected and passed, and also in the notes shall be expressed, whether coloured or leaf; and the said notes shall be payable to the said owner, or bearer, and shall be current and received in payment of all debts and contracts for tobacco, or judgments and decrees on contracts for tobacco, according to the terms and intention of the contract, &c, and shall be transferable from one person to another, and shall be paid, upon demand, by the inspector or inspectors who signed the same; and no tender of any debt or contract for tobacco, or judgment or decree on any contract for tobacco, shall be lawful, unless payment of the same shall be tendered in inspector or inspectors note or notes.—1789, c. 26, § 27.

2. Inspectors notes shall be current and received in payment and satisfaction of all contracts for tobacco, and judgments and decrees on contracts for tobacco, subject to the deduction of 6 per cent. when paid or received in lieu of crop tobacco, and of 10 per cent. when paid or received in lieu of any crop tobacco clear of cask, according to the terms and intention of the contract, judgment or decree, as the case may be, and shall be transferable from one to another in all such tobacco payments, and shall be paid and satisfied, by the inspector or inspectors who signed the same, upon demand.—*ibid.* § 31.
