

good, necessary, and convenient warehouses on such land, and purchase all necessaries and conveniencies to carry this act into execution, and the expences for the same shall be assessed and collected on and from the inhabitants of such county as the county assessment, and paid by the sheriff or collector to the order of the said justices or any 3 of them.—*ibid.* § 58.

9. The justices, or any three or more of them, of Frederick and Washington counties, may upon application made to them by any person or persons, to determine and fix upon the most proper place in their county to prepare or build and erect a warehouse for the reception and inspection of tobacco as soon thereafter as may be necessary, and appoint an inspector or inspectors for their said warehouse, provided such person or persons making such application shall prepare, or build and erect the same at his or their own expence, so that the same be sufficient to contain and secure all the tobacco offered for inspection at said warehouse, and furnishing scales, weights, prizes, and all other things necessary for that purpose; and such person or persons erecting said warehouse, shall levy and receive from the owner or owners of tobacco 2s. 6d. per hoghead for all tobacco received, kept and delivered, in good order, within one year, and 3d. for every month thereafter they shall take care of the said tobacco after the expiration of said one year, until the same shall be delivered in good order.—*ibid.* § 66.

10. The justices of Cæcil county shall not be obliged to meet for the purpose of appointing warehouses, or nominating inspectors, in their county, unless it shall appear necessary to the said justices so to appoint and nominate, for the purpose of preventing frauds in the exportation of tobacco.—*ibid.* § 69.

11. The justices of Harford county, and the several counties on the eastern shore, when met to appoint warehouses and nominate inspectors, according to the directions of this act, shall agree and determine on the day or days in every week, between the 1 of April and 20 of Sept. or between the 20 of Sept. and the 1 of Nov. on which the said inspectors in the said counties shall be obliged to attend at their respective warehouses for the purposes of this act, and such inspectors shall not be obliged to attend on any other day or days, than such as shall be agreed and determined on by the said justices respectively, unless thereto required.—*ibid.* § 70.

12. The justices of the peace, or any 3 or more of them for the several counties, shall annually, between the 15 and 25 days of Jan. meet at the place where their respective county courts are held, and nominate inspectors agreeably to the directions of the act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; and where the same person or persons are nominated who had the preceding year officiated as inspector or inspectors, under commission from the governor, he or they may continue to act
