

of said work to the levy court of the county or counties refusing or neglecting to appoint a commissioner as aforesaid, and it is hereby declared to be the duty of said levy court or courts so refusing or neglecting to appoint a commissioner, to levy one half, or one third, of the amount, as the case may be, of such expences, upon their county, to be collected as other county taxes are, and the collector shall transmit the amount thereof to the levy court of the county or counties which has or have contracted for said bridge.—*ibid.* § 6.

8. If any collector shall proceed to the sale of any goods or chattels to enforce the payment of the county charge, he shall be entitled to receive the same fees as are or shall be established by law on the service of executions.—*ibid.* § 7.

9. The justices of the peace in the several counties, at the time of their meeting to lay the county assessment, shall appoint the constables and overseers of the roads for their respective counties, in the same manner, and with the same power and authority, as they have been heretofore appointed by the respective county courts.—*ibid.* § 8.

10. Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize or empower the said justices of the respective counties to allow any claim or claims, charge or charges, against their said counties, not properly chargeable to the same, to which the claimant shall not produce a legal voucher.—*ibid.* § 11.

11. Wherever the amount of the allowance to the poorhouses in any county or counties of this state is ascertained and fixed by acts of assembly now in force, nothing in this act shall be held or construed to empower the justices of the levy courts of such county or counties to increase the said allowance.—*ibid.* § 12.

12. But nothing in this act shall be taken or construed to repeal any part of an act passed at this present session, entitled, An act to alter the mode of collecting the county tax in Harford county.—*ibid.* § 13.

13. The respective justices of the peace, composing the levy courts in the several counties of Saint Mary's, Talbot, Kent, Somerset, Cæcil, Queen Anne's, Worcester, Harford, and Prince-George's, instead of meeting as heretofore required by law, shall forever hereafter meet at the usual places for holding the county courts in the several counties aforesaid as follows, viz. In Saint Mary's, Queen-Anne's, Kent, Somerset, Worcester, and Prince-George's, counties, on the 1 Monday in April in every year hereafter, in Talbot county, on the 3 Monday in Feb. in every year, in Cæcil, and Harford counties on the 2 Monday in April in every year.—1793, c. 46, § 2.
