13. The oath of chancellor. "I, A. B. chancellor, do solemnly promise and swear, that, as chancellor, I will do equal right and justice according to law, equity, and good conscience, in every case in which I shall act as chancellor, freely without sale, fully without denial, and speedily without delay, and will behave myself justly, honestly and faithfully, in the said office, according to the best of my knowledge and understanding. So help me God."—*ibid.*

14, 15. The oath of the judge or justice of any court. "I, A. B. judge or justice, do solemnly promise and swear, that (as judge or justice) I will do equal right and justice according to the law of this state, in every case in which I shall act as judge or justice, freely without sale, fully without any denial, and speedily without delay, and will behave myself justly, honestly and faithfully, in the said office, according to the best of my knowledge and understanding. So help me God."—*ibid.*

16. The oath of an attorney at law. "I, A. B. do solemnly promise and swear, that I will well and truly behave and demean myself in the office of attorney of _____ court, in all things appertaining to the duties thereof, according to the best of my skill and judgment. So help me God."—*ibid.*

17. The oath of attorney-general, clerk of the general and county courts, and all other civil officers of this state. "I, A. B. do solemnly promise and swear, that I will well and truly behave and demean myself in the office of _____ in all things appertaining to the duties thereof, according to the best of my skill and judgment, and without favour, affection or partiality. So help me God."—*ibid.*

18. The oaths to the governor shall be administered to him by the president of the senate in the senate house, in the presence of the members of the general assembly; and the oaths to the members of the council shall be administered by the president of the senate, or any judge or justice; and the oaths to the chancellor shall be administered to him by the governor, at the time of delivering to him the great seal of this state; and any judge or justice may qualify before any one in commission with him, or before any qualified judge or justice, which qualification shall be certified by the judge or justice before whom the same is made, and shall be recorded by the court of which the judge or justice so qualified is or shall be a member.—*ibid.* § 2.

19. The justices of the orphans courts, before they proceed to business, shall severally take the oath of allegiance and fidelity to this state
