

ing the roads in the county where the offence is committed, and be paid to, and accounted for, by the supervisor of the district.—*ibid.* § 14.

14. The supervisor in Allegany county, shall summon every free able-bodied male person, and also the master or mistress of any male servant, above the age of 16 years, in his district, to assist in repairing the public roads, and those refusing shall forfeit 10s. current money, and every master or mistress, refusing herein, shall forfeit for each person 10s. but every person summoned, under this act, and every master or mistress of servants, in lieu of working may pay to the supervisor of the said district 3s. 9d. for every day.—*ibid.* § 15.

15, 16, 17, 18. The supervisor in said county who shall neglect to summon every free able-bodied male person, or the master, &c. who shall neglect to recover the fine or fines aforesaid, shall forfeit 10s. for every such offence; but no supervisor shall summon any person above 4 days in each year; and any person or persons who shall, on or before the 1 day of Sept. annually, pay to the supervisor of his or her district, 15s. current money for each person liable to assist in the repairing the public roads shall not, for 1 year thereafter, be liable to the penalties of this act, and the supervisor shall lay out the monies he may receive, in the same manner he is authorised to dispose of the money levied for repairing the public roads by this act; and they are directed to lay before the levy court, on their annual meeting, an account on oath of the receipt and expenditure of the money received and expended by this act.—*ibid.* § 16, 17, 18, 19.

19. All fines and forfeitures by this act imposed, under the sum of 10l. current money, shall be recovered as small debts out of court; and every justice of the peace, before whom recovered, shall lay a particular account of the same before the justices of the succeeding levy court.—*ibid.* § 20.

20. The act, entitled, An act for the marking of highways, and making the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and swamps passable, passed in 1704, and supplements, and also the Act for repairing public roads in this province, shall be void, so far as they relate to the counties within this act mentioned; and the act to streighten and amend the public roads in Cæcil county, passed in 1791, is repealed; but no new road already laid out by the justices of the levy court of Cæcil county shall be opened through any buildings, enclosed yard, garden or orchard, against the consent of the owner or owners thereof.—*ibid.* § 22.

21. Nothing in this act shall repeal the act for laying out sundry turnpike roads in Baltimore county, and the supplementary acts thereto, and so much of the act to streighten and amend the several public roads in several counties, as relates to Baltimore county, or to withdraw the funds appropriated to the purposes in the said acts mentioned.—*ibid.* § 23.
