

5. The treasurer of the western shore shall finally ascertain the value of all escheat lands and improvements thereon, and of all improvements on cultivated land, and shall receive the money therefor from the party.—*ibid.* § 9.

6, 7. The sum of 25s. current money, impleaded by the act, entitled An act concerning marriages, for every marriage licence received by the clerks of the county courts of the eastern shore, and paid by them to the treasurer of the said shore, shall remain in his hands, subject to the orders of the visitors and governors of Washington college.—1784, c. 7, § 3. And the like sum, received by the clerks of any of the counties of the western shore, and paid by them to the treasurer of the said shore shall remain in his hands, subject to the order of the visitors and governors of Saint John's college.—*ibid.* c. 37, § 20.

8. The treasurers shall be directed to pay no interest, nor to allow any in discount where specie is or may be demandable, on any certificates issued by this state, which can be subscribed under the act of Congress making provision for the debt of the United States. *Resol.* 1790.

9. The treasurer of the western shore shall keep the money paid to him agreeably to the act for establishing and securing the salary of the chancellor, a part from all other money, to be applied towards the payment of the salary aforesaid, quarterly, and if it should not be sufficient, the deficiency shall be made up out of any monies in the treasury arising from the sale of vacant lands.—*Nov.* 1792, c. 76, § 6.

10. The treasurer of the western shore shall pay to the adjutant-general of this state for the time being, 200l. current money, in quarterly payments, provide he reside or keep an office at the seat of government.—*Resol.* 1794.

11. The treasurer of the eastern shore shall finally ascertain the value of all escheat lands and improvements, and all improvements on cultivated lands returned and certified by the surveyor, and shall receive the money therefor from the party.—1795, c. 61, § 4.

13. The treasurers of the western and eastern shores, or either of them, shall pay out of any unappropriated or surplus money which shall be in their treasuries, unto each juryman of the general court on the western and eastern shores, or his assigns, on producing a certificate from either of the clerks of said court, such sum as may appear to be due upon the face of such certificate, and the said payments shall be made at the city of Annapolis, or the town of Easton. 1797, c. 94, § 2.
