T R E S P A S S.

1. **I**N all actions for trespass committed on real property only, which may be brought in the general court, judgment shall be given for the plaintiff for the damages recovered or assessed, with costs in such action, without any regard to the sum recovered or assessed. 1785, c. 87, § 3.

2. If any person commit a trespass on real property, and shall remove from the shore on which such property may lie to the other shore, or cannot be taken on the shore on which such property may lie, such trespasser may be sued in the court of any county where found, or in the general court for the shore on which he or she may be, and if any trespass shall be committed on any real property, and the person committing the same shall remove from the county where such property may lie, or cannot be found in such county, such trespasser may be sued in any county where he or she may be found, or in the general court, at the election of the party injured.—*ibid.* § 4. U N I V E R S I T Y.

1. **W**ASHINGTON, and Saint-John's colleges, consolidated into one university, by the name of "The University of Maryland," whereof the governor shall be chancellor, and the principal of one of the said colleges vice-chancellor, either by seniority or election, according to such rule or bye-law of the university as may be made in that case.—1784, c. 37, § 33.

2. After 13 visitors and governors shall be chosen for Saint-John's college, the chancellor shall call a meeting of the visitors and governors of the said two colleges, or a representation of at least 7 visitors, &c. from each of them, and two members of the faculty of each of them, (the principal if any being one) to be styled, "The convocation of the University of Maryland," and at their first meeting (to be continued on adjournments by the chancellor) shall frame a body of bye-laws or ordinances, relating to the general government of the university, as to uniformity of manners and literature in the said colleges, the receiving, hearing and determining, appeals from any of the members, students or scholars
