

ing, enlarging and repairing, public warehouses, the making of wharfs, the building, enlarging and repairing, any warehouses for the respective inspections appointed; and in case the proprietor, guardian or attorney of the proprietor, of any warehouse, or any other person concerned therein, shall refuse or neglect to make such buildings, &c. as shall be wanting at any other time of the year, as the said justices shall direct, they shall have the same done at the expence of the county; and the justices of such county shall receive so much of the rent of the said warehouse of the inspectors, which they shall withhold from the proprietors, and obliged to pay to the justices, as will reimburse the county the charges of such buildings, &c. and if, upon application of the inspectors to the justices, for building, &c. any warehouses or wharfs, they shall refuse or delay to do their duty therein; every justice so refusing shall forfeit 5l. current money.—*ibid.* § 48.

6. Where proprietors of warehouses have given the same up to be repaired or have been built at the expence of the county, and the rents already received have not reimbursed the money advanced in building such warehouses, the justices shall receive the rents of all such warehouses from the inspector or inspectors, until the whole money advanced and interest thereon shall be paid.—*ibid.* § 49.

7. If any warehouse shall be wilfully or for want of due care burnt by any inspector or inspectors, they and his and their securities, shall be answerable to the owners of all tobacco, burnt or damaged, to be recovered by action on the case, for so much tobacco, or money to the value of such tobacco, had and received to the use of the owner, provided a note, expressing the cause of action, be lodged in the office at the time of issuing the writ.—*ibid.* § 51.

8. If any person, other than the inspectors, shall hereafter make any fire within any public warehouse, or within the space of 50 yards thereof, such person, if free, shall for every such offence forfeit 5l. current money, and if a servant or slave, he or she shall, by order of any justice or any inspector, within such county, receive on his or her bare back, not exceeding 39 lashes, for every such offence.—*ibid.* § 55.

9. No person shall erect or build, any chimney, except brick or stone, within 100 yards of any public warehouse; and where any except brick or stone, is already built within the distance aforesaid, the owner or proprietor shall pull it down, or on refusal or neglect so to do in 6 months, the sheriff of the county shall upon notice, under the penalty of 50l. current money, cause such chimney to be pulled down, and the inspectors shall, under the penalty of 20l. current money, give notice to the sheriff of their respective counties of any chimnies being erected, contrary to this act, as soon as may be.—*ibid.* § 56.
