

12 months in any public warehouse, shall be chargeable with 3d. per month for every month thereafter, and the inspector or inspectors shall receive and pay the same to the justices of the county, if such warehouse belongs to the county, if not to the owner of the warehouse.—*ibid.* § 61.

The 67 and 73 § of the above act, relates to warehouses erected and to be erected in Frederick, Washington and Anne-Arundel counties, the act of 1790, c. 30, § 4 and 5, to warehouses to be erected in George town; and 1791, c. 52 to a warehouse to be established at Beard's point, Anne-Arundel county. See County clerks, 27. Justices of the peace.

W A R R A N T S.

ALL warrants without oath, or affirmation, to search suspected places, or to seize any person, or property, are grievous and oppressive; and all general warrants to search suspected places, or to apprehend suspected persons, without naming or describing the place, or the person in special, are illegal, and ought not to be granted. *Decl.* 23.

W A S H I N G T O N C O L L E G E.

1, 2. **T**HE visitors of Kent county school, and their successors, authorised to increase their number to 24, to be a corporation and body politic, to have continuance for ever, by the name of the visitors and governors of Washington college, in the state of Maryland, in honourable and perpetual memory of his excellency General Washington, to have perpetual succession; provided that 17 of the said visitors, &c. be residents on the eastern shore of this state.—*ibid.* § 3.

3, 4. The said visitors, &c. by the same name, shall be capable in law to purchase, to them and their successors, in fee, or otherwise, any lands, tenements, rents, annuities, pensions or other hereditaments, within this state, by the gift, &c. of any person, &c. capable to make the same, and such lands, &c. (excepting the estate of the said Kent county school) to grant, &c. for the furtherance of the said college; and may take and receive money, goods and chattels, given, sold or bequeathed, to them, and employ the same towards erecting, setting up and maintaining the said college, for the instruction, improvement and education of youth,
