### LITERARY INSTITUTIONS.

1. **T**HE sum of five hundred pounds, part of the sum heretofore appropriated to Washington college, shall be discontinued, after the first day of May next.—1798, c. 107, § 4.

2. The treasurer of the western shore shall be for ever hereafter authorized and required to pay annually, on or before the first day of June, to the several seminaries of learning herein after enumerated, in the following proportions, to wit: To the visitors and trustees of Washington academy, in Somerset county, or to their order, the sum of eight hundred dollars; to John Edmondson, Nicholas Hammond, Samuel Chamberlaine, Thomas J. Bullett, William Hayward, Ennolls Martia and Stephen Theodore Johnson, and their successors, as trustees for the use of an academy to be established in Talbot county, eight hundred dollars; to the president and trustees of Charlotte-Hall school, or to their order, eight hundred dollars; to the visitors and trustees of the Frederick county school, or to their order, eight hundred dollars.—*ibid.* § 3.

3. Charles Ridgely, of Hampton, Harry Dorsey Gough, Thomas Cockey, of Thomas, John Tolly Worthington, Patrick Allison, doctor John Carroll, doctor John Archer, Jesse Jarrett, Nicholas Day M'Comas, James Bond, doctor Jacob Hall and doctor Thomas H. Berckhead, be and hereby are appointed trustees for an academy to be erected in Baltimore or Harford county, and the said trustees shall locate, erect and superintend, the said academy, in the same manner that other trustees are authorized to do under the provisions of this act; and the said trustees are hereby authorized to receive from the treasurer of the western shore the sum of eight hundred dollars annually, at the several times on which the trustees for other academies instituted under this act are entitled to receive the same, and the said monies, when received, to apply, in their discretion, towards the purchase of grounds for the site of said academy, building the same, or payment of tutors therein employed; and the said trustees are also authorized to receive, by donation, any lands or tenements for the use and benefit of said school, provided the same are not in extent more than fifty acres, or personal property in amount not more than two thousand pounds.—*ibid.* § 4.

4. The visitors and directors of each of the schools aforesaid shall annually, on or before the twenty-fifth day of November in each year, return to the general assembly an account of all sums by them received in virtue of this act, the names of the persons to whom paid, for what use, as also a state of their respective schools, the name of the teacher or teachers engaged, and the number and names of the scholars actually at said schools, under the penalty of a forfeiture of their donations respectively upon a failure of making the return as aforesaid.—*ibid.* § 5.
