C H A P. LXXXII.

Passed 9th of June, 1692. An ACT touching coopers, and the gauge of tobacco hogheads. Lib. LL. fol. 230. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 37.

For three years, or to the end of the next session. Expired.

C H A P. LXXXIII.

An ACT for the ordering and regulating the militia of this province, for the better defence and security thereof. Lib. LL. fol. 235. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 72.

For three years, or to the end of the next session. Continued 1694, ch. 16. and 1695, ch. 16. An additional act 1695, ch. 17. Expired.

C H A P. LXXXIV.

An ACT of repeal of all laws heretofore made in this province, and confirming all laws made in this general assembly. Lib. LL. fol. 246. Lib. WH and L. fol. 145. and Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 43. Repealed 1704, ch. 77.

C H A P. LXXXV.

An ACT prohibiting trade with the Indians for deer skins, elk skins, or any furs whatsoever, without licence. Lib. LL. fol. 247. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 144. Repealed 1694, ch. 17.



1694. At a SESSION of ASSEMBLY, begun and held at the City of SAINT-MARY's, the 21st day of September, in the 6th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord and Lady WILLIAM and MARY, by the grace of God, of England, Scotland, France and Ireland, King and Queen, Defenders of the Faith, &c. *annoque domini* 1694, and ended the 18th October following.

An ACT confirming and making valid the last will and testament of Augustine Herman, late of Cæcil county, gentleman, as it now stands recorded in the commissary-general's office of this province. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 56. A Private Act.

An ACT for the naturalization of Peter Ferdinando, and his children, of Andrew Imbert, Claudius Dutitree, Gerrardus Weeffels, and James his son, Abraham Ambrose, Lewis de Roch Brune, John de Vagha, Herman Van Burkelo, Nicholas de la Montagne, Hendrick Sluyter, and Jacob Sluyter, junior. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 57. A Private Act.

C H A P. V.

An ACT touching coopers and the gauge of tobacco hogheads. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 58. Repealed 1704, ch. 77.

C H A P.
