An ACT for the division and regulating several counties within this province, and constituting a county, by the name of Prince-George's county, within the fame province. Lib. LL: No. 2. fol. 92.

N. B. By this act (1.) from and after the 23tl April; 1696, the bounds of St. Mary's county, shall begin at Point Look-out, N. B. By this set (1.) from and after the 23d April, 1090, the bounds of St. Mary's county, that begin at Point Look-out, and extend tifelf up Patowinack river, to the lower lide of Bud's creek, and so over by a streight line drawn from the head of the main branch of the said Bud's creek, to the head of Indian creek, in Patuzent river; including all that land lying between Patoxia and Point Look-out as aforessid. (2.) Upon the upper side of the said branches of Bud's and Indian creek, by the line of Charles county begin, where the upper bounds of St. Mary's ends; and extend itself upwards as far as Mattawomian creek and branch, and bounding on the said branch by a streight line drawn from the head thereof, to the head of Swanson's creek in Batuvens vives, including all that land lying on the upper part of Bud's creek and Indian creek lyinghes where St. Mary's and branch, and bounding on the faid branch by a fireight line drawn from the head thereof, to the head of Swanfon's creek in Patuxent river; including all that land lying on the upper part of Bud's creek and Indian creek branches, where St. Mary's county ends, to the lower fide of Mattawoman creek and branch, and Swanfon's creek and branch, between Patuxent and Patowmack rivers, as aforefaid. (3.) The land from the upper fide of Mattawoman and Swanfon's creek and branch, between Patuxent and Patowmack, bounded by Patowmack on the well, and by Patuxent river on the east, shall be, and is hereby constituted, founded and incorporated into a county of this province, and shall be denominated, called and known, by the fiame of Prince Geome's county; and shall, from and after the faid 23d day of April next ensuing, being St. George's day, have and enjoy all prince rights, benefits and privileges, equal with the other counties of this province; such as sending surgestes to assemble shall, and other officers and ministers requisite and necessary, and as are used in other counties, shall province. (4.) Commissioners appointed, who shall, at or before the said 23d day of April, cause the said two lines, from the head of Bud's creek branch, to the head of Indian creek branch, and from the head of Mattawoman branch to Swalson's creek branch, fully to be marked and lined by a should line of marked trees, that the same may be known and perceived by all persons, desiring to know the same; and shall return a certificate of the die course thereof, one to each county concerned, add one more certificate to the governor and council, to be recorded in the council records, and each county court's records, as a storefaid. (5.) St. Mary's county court to be held for ever hereafter at the state-houle of the city of St. Mary's, being hereby allowed and appointed to the county of St. Mary's for holding and keeping their courts in and such other decent services, as to the justices of the same county, in full court, shall be consented and the fame county of St. Mary's for nothing and keeping their courts in and fuch other necest iervices, as to the justices of the fame county, in full court, shall be consented and agreed to. (6.) The Illand of Kent to be added to, and made part of Talbot county. (7.) That part of Talbot county lying on the north side of Corsica creek, running up the main eastern branch, to the head thereof, and then with a course drawn east; to the outside of this province, shall be the southerly bounds of the county of Kent, and on the north by the county of Cacil. (8.) Commissioners appointed to cause the bounds between Kent and Talbot counties to be run out and marked by a double line of trees, and return certificate thereof as aforesaid.
