C H A P. XV.

Passed 12th of Nov. 1698. An ACT for ascertaining the bounds of a certain tract of land to the use of the Nanticoke Indians, so long as they shall occupy and live upon the same. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 166. Repealed 1704, ch. 77.

C H A P. XVI.

An ACT empowering trustees to purchase lands adjoining to the fountains of healing waters, called the Cool Springs. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 168.

C H A P. XVII.

An ACT for the more speedy conveying of the public letters and packets of this province, and settling a revenue upon the sheriffs for defraying the charge thereof. Repealed.

C H A P. XVIII.

An ACT to enable William Coursey and Elizabeth his wife, or the survivor of them, to sell and acknowledge such lands as were left by colonel Vincent Lowe to be sold for the payment of his just debts. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 171. A Private Act.

C H A P. XIX.

An ACT for the more effectual suppressing of profane cursing and swearing. Repealed.

C H A P. XX.

An ACT empowering vestrymen to assess their parishioners for finishing and repairing churches. Repealed.

C H A P. XXI.

An ACT appointing how public officers shall recover their dues accruing for their office. Repealed.

C H A P. XXII.

An ACT for the punishment of privateers and pirates. Repealed.

C H A P. XXIII.

An ACT for vesting two tracts of land in John Gadby, sold him by George Norman. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 173. A Private Act.

C H A P. XXIV.

An ACT for preventing sheriffs from summoning delegates and justices of the peace to serve as jurors in this province. Repealed.

C H A P. XXV.

An ACT for assessing the public levy of this province.
