

Passed 9th of May, 1700. An ACT empowering a committee to lay, assess and apportion the public levy for this present year, 1700. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 398. C H A P. XL.



1701. At a SESSION of ASSEMBLY, begun and held at the Town and Port of ANNAPOLIS, the 8th day of May, and ended the 17th, in the 13th year of our Sovereign Lord WILLIAM the Third, by the Grace of God, of England, Scotland, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, *annoque domini* 1701, were enacted the following laws, viz.

Passed 17th of May, 1701. An ACT for the more speedy obtaining execution against persons flying out of the county where judgment is recovered against them. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 419. Repealed 1704, ch. 77. C H A P. I.

An ACT for laying an imposition of three-pence per hoghead on tobacco, for defraying the public charge of the province. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 420. For three years, &c. Expired. C H A P. II.

An ACT empowering a committee to lay, assess and apportion the public levy this present year, one thousand seven hundred and one. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 421. C H A P. III.

An ACT investing a tract of land in Dorothy Stevens, sold her by Simon Willmer, to her and her heirs for ever. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 422. A Private Act. C H A P. IV.

An ACT investing in the vestry of St. James's parish, in Anne-Arundel county, certain lands given to the said parish by Mr. James Rigby, and Elizabeth his wife, both deceased. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 422. A Private Act. C H A P. V.

An ACT for the naturalization of Peter Scamper, of Prince-George's county, John Debruter, of Baltimore county, and John Debruter and William Debruter, his sons, together with the other sons and daughters of the said Debruter the father, born in this province. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 423. A Private Act. C H A P. VI.
