

1703. OCTOBER. 2011 ANNAPOLIS


At a SESSION of ASSEMBLY, begun and held at the Port of ANNAPOLIS, on the 26th, and ended the 29th day of October, in the second year of the reign of her most sacred Majesty Queen ANNE, of England, &c. *annoque domini* 1703, were enacted the following laws.

CHAP. V.
An ACT reviving an (b) act for quieting differences that may arise between her majesty's subjects within this province, and the several nations of Indians of what places soever. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 432.
(b) 1700, ch. 6, hereby revived for three years. Expired.
