An ACT reviving an (c) act for laying an imposition of three-pence per hoghead on tobacco, for defraying the public charge of this province. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 433. Passed 3d of May, 1704.

C H A P. VII.

An ACT reviving an (d) act for summoning grand and petit juries. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 433.
(d) 1699, ch. 29, hereby revived for three years. Expired.

C H A P. VIII.

An ACT reviving an (e) act for ordering and regulating the militia of this province, for the better defence and security thereof. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 434.
(e) 1699, ch. 47, hereby revived for three years. Expired.

C H A P. IX.

An ACT for reviving an (f) act for raising a supply towards the defraying the public charge of this province, and to prevent too great a number of Irish papists being imported into this province. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 435.
(f) 1699, ch. 29, hereby revived for three years, or to the end of the next session. Expired.

C H A P. X.

An ACT for settling a revenue on her majesty's present governor. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 436.
Expired.

C H A P. XI.

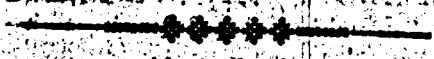
An ACT for repealing a clause in an act of assembly, entitled, An act for establishment of religious worship in this province, &c. and also for appointing the oaths of abjuration to be taken in this province. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 437.

C H A P. XII.

An ACT to declare, how the forty pounds of tobacco per poll, in such parishes where there is no incumbent, shall be disposed of. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 446. Repealed 1715, ch. 49, and 1719, ch. 16.

C H A P. XIII.

An ACT for the sale of part of the lands of captain Henry Smith, late of Somerset county, for the payment of his just debts. Lib. LL. No. 2. fol. 442. A Private Act.
