BE IT ENACTED, by the Queen's most excellent majesty, by and with the advice and consent of her majesty's Governor, Council and Assembly, of this province, and the authority of the same, That the act of assembly, entitled, An act for the punishment of persons suborning witnesses, or committing wilful and corrupt perjury, and every matter, clause and thing therein contained, is hereby declared to be and remain in full force and effect, to all intents, constructions and purposes whatsoever.
