

At a SESSION of ASSEMBLY begun and held at the City of ANNAPOLIS, in Anne-Arundel county, the 26th day of October, and ended the 11th day of November, in the 8th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady ANNE, Queen of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, and the dominions and territories thereto belonging, Defender of the Faith, &c. *annoque domini* 1709, were enacted the following laws.

C H A P. I.

Passed 11th of Nov. 1709. An ACT confirming, and making good and valid in law, a certain lease, or deed of demise, made between Robert Smith, late of Talbot county, Esquire, deceased, and Matthew Mafon, of the same county, planter. Lib. LL. No. 3. fol. 383. A Private Act.

C H A P. II.

An ACT confirming, and making good and effectual in law, a certain deed or release made by Susannah Tracey, wife of Thomas Tracey, late of Anne-Arundel county, carpenter, to James Heath, of the same county, gentleman. Lib. LL. No. 3. fol. 384. A Private Act.

An ACT appointing how long suspected runaways shall lie in prison, and for the discharge of Indian Harry, late a prisoner in Somerset county. Lib. LL. No. 3. fol. 385.
