C H A P. II.
An ACT empowering Thomas Edmondson, of Talbot county, surviving executor of his father John Edmondson, to sell and dispose of the lands by the said John Edmondson left for the payment of his debts. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 3. A Private Act.

C H A P. III.
An ACT to reform the ill practices of high sheriffs within this province. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 4.
For three years. Expired.

C H A P. IV.
An ACT reviving and continuing an act of assembly of this province, entitled, (a) An act for the ordering and regulating the militia of this province, for the better security and defence thereof, and for supplying some defects therein. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 6.
(a) 1704, ch. 87, hereby continued to the end of the first session of assembly after the arrival of a governor.

C H A P. V.
An ACT for ascertaining the gauge of tobacco hogheads, and to prevent cropping, cutting and defacing tobacco taken on board ships and vessels upon freight. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 7.

C H A P. VIII.
An ACT for the naturalization of David Pagett, of Queen-Anne's county, planter, and Maudlin his wife, and their children. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 13. A Private Act.

C H A P. IX.
An ACT to invest two tracts of land in Richard Bennet, Esquire, late the land of John Howel, deceased. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 14. A Private Act.

C H A P. X.
An ACT confirming, and making good and effectual in law a certain deed or release made by Susannah Tracey, wife of Thomas Tracey, late of Anne-Arundel county, carpenter, to James Heath, of Queen-Anne's county, gentleman. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 16. A Private Act.

C H A P. XI.
An ACT confirming to major John Hawkins and Henry Wright, of Queen-Anne's county, certain lands therein mentioned. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 17. A Private Act.

C H A P. XII.
An ACT for settling and vesting an estate of inheritance in fee-simple of and in one hundred and fifty acres of land, lying in Calvert county, on William Hickman, of Calvert county, carpenter, son and heir of William Hickman, deceased, and by the said Hickman the father purchased of and from a certain Thomas Hinton. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 19. A Private Act.

C H A P. XIII.
An ACT empowering Robert Roberts, of Queen-Anne's county, to sell part of a tract of land lying in Cæcil county, called New Munster, late the land of John Toas, for the uses therein mentioned, and to make good and valid such sale. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 20. A Private Act.
