C H A P. IV.

Passed 3d of July, 1714.

An ACT for relieving the inhabitants of this province from some grievances in the prosecution of suits at law. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 106.

This act was to continue three years, &c. Further continued by 1718, ch. 2, 1721, ch. 2, 1723, ch. 4, 1727, ch. 4, 1731, ch. 12, 1735, ch. 19, and expired in 1740. It was again revived by 1742, ch. 3, for three years, &c. and continued by 1746, ch. 4, 1750, ch. 3, 1753, ch. 8, 1757, ch. 3, 1760, ch. 12, and 1763, ch. 4, for three years &c. by November, 1766, ch. 21, for seven years, &c. and by November, 1773, ch. 17, for twenty-one years, &c. when it expired.

An ACT reviving a certain act of assembly of this province, entitled, "An act for limitation of officers fees, and for supplying some defects therein; and also reviving another act of assembly of this province, entitled, (a) An act explaining some doubtful expressions in the act for limitation of officers fees.
